## Specialization (5)

- Electives/Specialization at Henan University:

- Electives can be chosen from the intensive summer classes taught by visiting professors from the US/Europe and BRICS NU
- Electives/Specialization abroad:
- Students pick a host university and 5 of their electives
- Professor from Henan University (and host university) has to approve choice to guarantee academic rigor
